Grand Prismatic Spring was our #1 must do item and it didn't disappoint! Prismatic means brilliantly colored. The intense blue color in the center of this hot spring is due to sunlight being scattered by fine particles suspended in the water. The yellow, orange and brown colors encircling the hot spring are caused by thermophiles - heat loving microorganisms.

We also loved the different geysers. Predictable yet not predictable...Old Faithful Geyser, White Dome Geyser, Great Fountain Geyser, Palette Spring Geyser are some of our favorites!
